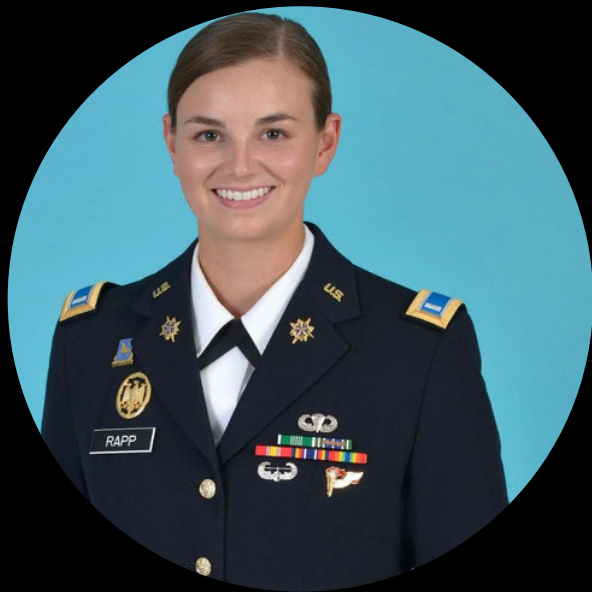

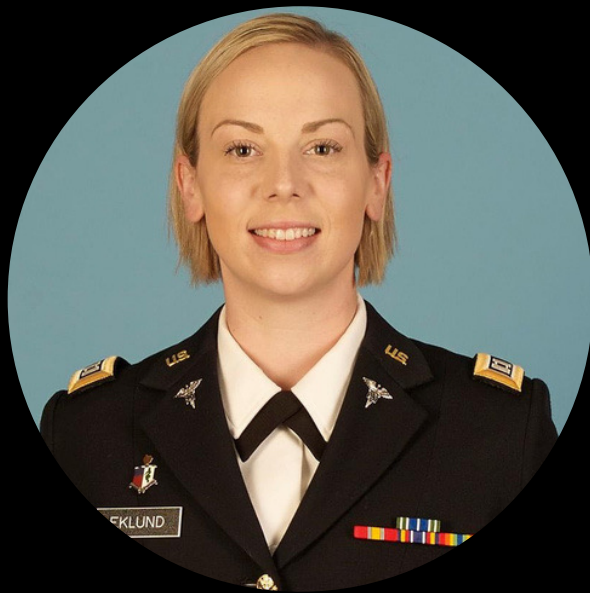
MAJ BRENT THOMPSON, JD
